All Horse Registration Forms must be received at the Extension Office by May 1st. ((MSU Extension Office, 801 Hazen St, Paw Paw, MI 49079 269-657-8213). Items due at the Extension Office by June 15th are: Fair Entry Forms for all Departments at Fair and Jumping Consent Forms. Beginning in 2022 all registration forms must be completed online. - All equine exhibitors must read and follow the EXHIBITORS RULES in the Fair Book and the current VBYF Horse and Pony Rules.
- 2. A negative EIA (Coggins) test that is valid through fair week should be presented to the check-in veterinarian prior to admission to the fairgrounds. An additional copy of this Coggins along with your 3x5 Emergency Card must also be provided, preferably at the pre-Thursday fair set-up meeting. No equine will be admitted unless their Coggins copy is provided no later than check-in.
- 3. Stallions will be allowed only during the year foaled.
- 4. Exhibitors shall lead their animals unless in exercise and show areas. Exhibitors are the only ones allowed to ride their animals. Exercise times are from 6:00 am to 9:00 pm. Pee Wee exhibitors must be accompanied by a responsible adult during exercise time.
 - 5. All exhibitors must participate in a showmanship class; and all equine over 3 years of age (with the exception of "in-hand") must show in an equitation/horsemanship class. Consequences for missing either class will be loss of premium, no further classes may be entered, and the equine must remain until 6:00 am Sunday with proper care and exercise. We will do our best to work with you if there is a conflict due to showing other species.
 - 6. The Fair Board's CODE OF CONDUCT will be strictly enforced. Unsportsmanlike conduct or other objectionable behavior will not be tolerated and may result in removal from the horse complex. Also, exhibitors may lose state selection, points, and/or trophies.
 - 7. The veterinarian and/or judge may determine if an equine should be permitted on the fairgrounds or in the show arena. If they are unable, a horse superintendent will locate an alternate

qualified person to assist in the decision. The following conditions will be assessed:

- 1. Horses shall not show any signs of contagious disease.
- 2. Horses shall not show obvious lameness.
- Horses shall not be infested with external parasites, fleas, ticks, rain rot or be otherwise obviously diseased or unthrifty.
- 4. Horses shall not be underweight. They need to be in proper condition to undergo the stresses of fair week. Please be sure your horse is being fed properly before, during, and after fair.
- 1. Any protests or complaints shall follow the guidelines in the Fair Book under "Exhibitor's Rules: Complaint and Appeals Procedure."
